The Leonine Prayers

In 1884 Pope Leo XIII was given to see a vision in which it was revealed to him the influence that the devil would have in the Church in the near future. In response to this vision, Pope Leo commanded the prayers which would come to be known as the "Leonine Prayers" to be said after every Low Mass to petition heaven for aid. During the penitential seasons of Lent and Advent we will be saying those prayers in the language of the Church, Latin.

Ave Maria

Ave María, grátia plena, Dóminus tecum, benedícta tu in muliéribus, et benedíctus frúctus véntris tui, Jesús.

Sáncta María, Mater Déi, ora pro nóbis peccatóribus, nunc et in hora mortis nóstrae. Amen.

Salve Regina

Sálve Regina, Máter misericórdiae, vita, dulcédo, et spes nóstra, sálve. Ad te clamámus, éxsules filii Evae. Ad te suspirámus geméntes et fientes in hac lacrymárum valle. Eia ergo, advocáta nóstra, illos tuos misericórdes óculos ad nos convérte. Et Jesús, benedíctum frúctum véntris tui, nóbis, post hoc exilium osténde. O clémens, o pía, o dúlcis Virgo María.

Days of Fast & Abstinence

Current Laws of the Church

Days of Abstinence

- Begins on one's 14th birthday.
- Ash Wednesday & Fridays of Lent.
- Obliges abstention from flesh meat.

Required Days of Fast

- Applies to everyone aged 18 to 59, inclusive
- One full meal permitted and two other meals which, when combined, are less than a full meal
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fast and abstinence.

All Fridays of Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat.

Eucharistic Fast

Under the new Code of Canon Law, the Fast for Holy Communion is one hour before the reception of the Holy Eucharist. Those who are able to maintain the previous discipline of the three-hour fast are still encouraged to do so.

Days of Penance

- Applies to all the Faithful.
- Every day of Lent and Fridays outside of Lent.
- The obligation to do penance is lifted on Fridays which are also celebrated as a solemnity.

Discipline of 1962

Laws of Fasting

- Applies for those aged 21 to 59, inclusive
- Days of Lent from Ash Wednesday, inclusive, Ember Days and Vigils of Christmas, Pentecost and the Assumption
- One full meal permitted and two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal

Eucharistic Fast

The complete fast from all food and drink (except water or medicine) for three hours before the reception of Holy Communion. Those who are able to maintain the midnight fast, which was the previous discipline, are still encouraged to do so.

Palm Sunday - April 2nd

Easter Sunday - April 9th

Abstinence - Not eating the flesh meat from warm-blooded animals. Eggs are permitted. Traditional Moral Theologians say stocks derived from meat should not be eaten.

Fasting- Limiting oneself to eating one meal per day. Two small "collations," or snacks may be permitted to maintain one's strength, but combined they should not equal a full meal.

Laws of Abstinence

- Applies on one's 7th Birthday
- Complete Abstinence on all Fridays of the year, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and the Vigil of Christmas

Partial Abstinence

- (meat & soup or gravy made from meat permitted once a day at principal meal):
- Days of Lent, the Ember Days of Wednesday and Saturday, and the Vigils of Pentecost & the Assumption

Abstinence from meat is dispensed on Holy Days of Obligation
